At first, your children found this difficult, they are now able to verbalise how they feel and how to help themselves if they feel sad or worried. We use the Zones of Regulation in each classroom. This helps to identify how we feel and how to change our mood. Please ask your child about it, it may be something useful for you to try at home.

Next week we will be thinking about being Respectful, supported by Winnie The Pooh.



Winnie the Pooh teaches us how to share, work with others, and think of the feelings of others.

How parents can help

Encourage children to

- · open the door for others
- take turns in games and conversations
- · listen to others

All of our Learning Behaviours link to the UNICEF Rights of the Child. Next week, we will be focusing on Article 31 - "every child shall have time to play and time to rest when we are tired".

Technology and Young Children

Smartphone-free Childhood

We are all aware of the enormous challenges technology poses to parents of young children. A recent survey from Ofcom revealed some startling, and worrying, statistics. I have added a summary of the report;

- Around a quarter of 5-7-year-olds (24%) now own a smartphone, while three-quarters use a tablet (76%).
- Compared to a year ago, a higher proportion of 5-7s go online to send messages or make voice/video calls (59% to 65%) or to watch live-streamed content (39% to 50%).
- Similarly, overall use of social media sites or apps among all 5-7s has increased year-on-year (30% to 38%), with WhatsApp (29% to 37%), TikTok (25% to 30%), Instagram (14% to 22%) and Discord (2% to 4%) seeing particular growth in this age group.

- Online gaming among 5-7 year-olds has also seen a significant annual increase 41%, up from 34% with more children of this age playing shooter games than ever before (15%, up from 10%).
- While around two in five parents of 5-7-year-olds (42%) say they use social media sites and apps together with their child, a third (32%) report that their child uses social media independently.
- Compared to last year, parents of these younger children are more likely to say they would allow their child to have a profile on social media services before they had reached the minimum age required (30%, up from 25%).
- It follows that more children of this age now have their profiles on YouTube or YouTube Kids (48%, from 39%), WhatsApp (11%, from 7%) and Instagram (9%, from 5%) than a year ago.
- A third (32%) of 8-17s say they have seen something worrying or nasty online in the last 12 months, but only 20% of parents of this age group report their child telling them they had seen something online that scared or upset them in the same time frame.

With this continued increase in children accessing the online world at an earlier age, it is so important that as a school we keep a key focus on online safety. Internet Matters. Org has a huge amount of information and resources for parents and carers to access. Several of our parents are interested in discussing this concern as a group and they are thinking about how parents can support each other in monitoring and restricting the use of phones, iPads, etc. Please look out for a meeting date.

Swimming

We are delighted to tell you that the swimming pool is ready for us to begin our sessions next week. Thank you to everyone who has donated money to help with the refurbishment and also donated towards lessons and the general running of the pool. Thanks also to our fantastic PTA who continue to raise money and to Mr Doyle and Mr Pozella, our site assistants who have been working hard to get things ready for your children.

Please could we remind you that all items of clothing must be named, including shoes, underwear, towels, and costumes. Children must wear a swimming hat and we recommend the cloth hats which are available on Parentpay. They cost £2.50, and are now available for purchase on Parentpay, we will put the hat into your child's bag after you have placed your order on Parentpay. If your child has long hair please ensure that this is tied up for swimming, it is very difficult for them to put on their hat if their hair is long and untied.

Layla, mum of Albie, is kindly organising the rota for us. So many of you have volunteered which is great. Unfortunately, we will have to cancel a session if we don't have enough parent help. We are currently concerned that the first session for year 2 on Tuesday 7 May will be cancelled if more volunteers do not come forward. It will be a huge disappointment for the children if we have to do this but we have to ensure that the sessions are managed safely with enough adult supervision. Please offer your help where you can and please sign up if you can to help with another class's volunteering session where there are gaps. If we have to cancel a session we will inform you during the day. Fingers crossed for some good weather, it is always lovely to swim when it is sunny. We do however still swim if it is colder or raining as our pool and changing rooms are heated. We will immediately cancel swimming if there is a chance of thunder and lightning.

Road Safety and Parking issues.

This week in assembly we talked about the importance of crossing the road safely. We discussed using the pedestrian crossing. I am pleased to say that your children took this very seriously. Please support this by talking to your children and teaching them about road safety, it is such an important skill for them to learn. Last week we were made aware of a very near miss on Crown Road. A child was using a scooter on the pavement and a car reversed out of a resident's drive, the car very nearly hit the child. Please could we remind you to supervise your children when they are on bikes or scooters as they can pick up speed very fast down the hill and may not be able to stop in time, and do not let them cross driveways without you.

Many families use the car to drop off and pick up children before and after school, and the majority of you park sensibly. However, we are increasingly concerned about the parking on Crown Road, Lord Chancellors Walk, and also on Warren Road (a private road). A minority of parents continue to park over driveways and park on double yellow lines. We are also aware that several parents are using Warren Road to park. This week we have had a complaint that one of our parents abused the parking warden at the Warren Road gate and drove aggressively towards him. We have advised him to call the police as he has a photograph of the car registration. This is not acceptable behaviour and is not only unsafe but is also setting the worst example for your children. Please let us know if you witness this type of behaviour.

Lost property - please name all of your child's clothing



Last week we sorted through our lost property box and found nearly 50 good quality unnamed school jumpers that had been put in there since the Easter holiday. We cannot return any unnamed items to the children and therefore we have had to take home and wash all of these jumpers so that they can be added to our second hand uniform stock (rather than being thrown away). The children take their coats and jumpers off on warmer days and with 270 children in the school if an item is unnamed it is impossible to return it. Please name every item of clothing that your child brings to school - especially with swimming starting - to save our time in sorting through items and to save you from having to replace your child's clothing. Thank you for your support in this.

Volunteering in school - DBS checks

If you would like to help with swimming, trips or any other activity in school and do not yet have a DBS check through the school, please come to the school office to collect the application forms, or you can email admin@chi.rbksch.org and we will put them in your child's blue bag. If you have

completed a DBS check with us and have received your certificate in the post, we <u>must</u> see the certificate for our records, to complete the process. Please bring your certificate to the school office as soon as you receive it for us to take a copy. We also encourage you to sign up for the DBS update service (free to volunteers) within 28 days of receiving your certificate, <u>DBS Update Service - GOV.UK</u>. DBS certificates are valid for three years, if you need to check if you still have a valid certificate with us please contact the school office.

Pupil Premium Grant

When your child was admitted to the school we checked their eligibility for the Pupil Premium Grant. Please get in touch with us if your financial circumstances have changed since your child's eligibility was checked and you think you may now be eligible.
