Dear Families,

Our whole school celebrated UNICEF's Living in Peace Day on Thursday. Each Reception class started the day with a visit from our Year 2 Rights Respecting ambassadors who explained their role and the importance of understanding what rights all children are entitled to. The children made friendship bracelets, drew their best friends, and discussed what it means to be a good friend - these qualities were then used to create a friendship flower. They made a friendship cake which included extra ingredients of fun, kindness, listening, and sharing.













Year 1 spent their Living in Peace day discussing our UNICEF rights and the theme of friendship. They made posters to highlight what being a good friend means to them. They shared ideas such as

'helping others', 'sharing toys', 'being respectful', 'taking turns', and 'saying compliments to each other'.



The Year 2 children discussed the UNICEF articles, in particular, Article 2 which states that every child has rights "without discrimination of any kind, irrespective of the child's or his or her parent's or legal guardian's race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinions, national, ethnic or social origin, property, disability, birth or another status". The children discussed what kindness is, why their classmates are special and they enjoyed writing acrostic poems about kindness, friendship, and school. Inspired by our Winnie the Pooh characters, we thought about respect and responsibility and created a Year Group book around the Learning Behaviours - they are looking forward to sharing this with the rest of the school. Finally, they sang songs about togetherness and friendship.



Building work

The roof work is now complete and we will soon start to see the scaffolding being removed. Bee and Squirrel classes will be returning to their original classrooms on Monday afternoon. During half term, the demountable classroom in the year 1 playground will be removed and the playground surface will then be made safe. Unfortunately, the council is unable to resurface the whole playground. This work will impact access to the year 1 playground and the Reception classrooms for a short time.

Changes to Reception and Year 1 drop off and collection - Monday 3rd to Friday 7th June

Due to the removal of the roof scaffolding the following arrangements have been made: Morning drop off

Beginning on **Monday 3rd June** please could all children in **Year 1 and Reception** be dropped off in the ICT suite where staff will be waiting. Please could **all** parents drop off and leave the site promptly via the gate by the school office (not via the blue ramp).

Afternoon collection

Reception children will be picked up from the ICT suite at **3.00 pm**. Year 1 children will be picked up from the ICT suite at **3.10 pm**. Again, please leave the site promptly using the side gate next to the office to exit the site.

There will also be some changes to the Connections and Clubs collection rooms and we will advise you of this next week.

Year 2 trip to RHS Wisley Gardens

This a reminder to Year 2 parents to please make payment by Monday 20 May for the upcoming trip to Wisley Gardens on Monday 3 June. The cost is £15.25 per child which covers the cost of the coach and a small donation to the RHS. Although by law this has to be a voluntary contribution, we cannot afford this activity without financial help. We appreciate your support. The trip is on the first Monday back after half term so please let us know if you have any questions well in advance, many thanks.

Cake sale to raise funds for our school swimming pool

Next Wednesday there will be a cake sale to raise money towards our recent pool refurbishment. If you are able to donate any cakes or biscuits etc please bring them to the school office by Wednesday afternoon.

Sun protection

Now that the weather is getting warmer we are mindful of the importance of protecting children from the sun. We will share our updated sun protection policy with you next week. To protect children we recommend putting factor 30+ cream on them before school, sending in plenty of fresh water each day, and a bucket-style sun hat (named) If you send in suncream it must be in a named plastic roll-on bottle. Children must apply their cream to themselves, so it would be useful if you practise this at home. These can be bought on Amazon, search "sunscreen refillable applicators" for ideas.

Swimming volunteers - help needed and arrival time

Thank you again to everyone who has volunteered to help with our swimming sessions this week, they couldn't happen without your support. We have made a slight change to the time we ask our volunteers to arrive at the school, please arrive by 12.45 pm, sign in at the desk, and then our office staff will let you in to make your way down to the pool. Please ensure that you wear your lanyard as you walk through the school and walk around the MUGA on the field side. A reminder please not to put your name on the rota unless you are certain you have a valid, completed check with the school, if in doubt please check with the school office. Thank you for your ongoing support. We currently have the following slots that have not been filled for next week:

Swimming safety

As you know when a child has been sick or has an episode of diarrhoea we ask that they are absent from school for 48 hours. This is to avoid cross-infection with the other children and adults in the school. Following recent health and safety advice, we will also be enforcing our swimming pool policy that children who have had diarrhoea/vomiting will not be able to swim in our school pool for 14 days due to the risk of cryptosporidium being present. This parasite can live for up to 14 days and is highly resistant to chlorine (*cryptosporidium* is a parasite that causes a diarrheal illness called cryptosporidiosis). We need to put the health and safety of our children at the forefront of everything we do and we have made this decision following local authority and medical advice. Please let us know if your child has diarrhoea/vomiting during a weekend so that we are aware that they must not swim. Thank you for your cooperation.

Safely crossing Coombe Lane West - please use the pedestrian crossing

We urge you again to demonstrate a good road safety message to all of the children, they have recently been learning about this as part of Beep Beep Day, supported by Brake, the road safety charity. Unfortunately this week we are still seeing parents not using the pedestrian crossing and running their children through the traffic which is slowing or waiting for the lights. We ask you again not to do this as it is so dangerous and a poor example to set for the children, thank you for your co-operation.

Volunteering in school - DBS checks

If you would like to help with swimming, trips, or any other activity in school and do not yet have a DBS check through the school, please come to the school office to collect the application forms, or you can email <u>admin@chi.rbksch.org</u> and we will put them in your child's blue bag. If you have completed a DBS check with us and have received your certificate in the post, we <u>must</u> see the certificate for our records, to complete the process. Please bring your certificate to the school office as soon as you receive it for us to take a copy. We also encourage you to sign up for the DBS update service (free to volunteers) within 28 days of receiving your certificate, <u>DBS Update Service - GOV.UK</u>. DBS certificates are valid for three years, if you need to check if you still have a valid certificate with us please contact the school office.

Pupil Premium Grant

When your child was admitted to the school we checked their eligibility for the Pupil Premium Grant.
