Dear Families,

We are currently conducting tours of the school for prospective parents. Many of them have commented on how happy your children are and how lovely their manners are. We have been so pleased with the feedback.

This week, we have been thinking about being READY like Piglet and showing that we are ready for learning by sitting and listening well and looking at the teacher. Next week, we will be focusing on being RESILIENT like Tigger. Tigger teaches us to enjoy learning, ignore distractions, and learn from mistakes. You can help at home by encouraging your child to:-

- keep on going, even if a task is difficult
- talk about how you feel when you are taking on a challenge
- praise your children when they persevere
- help them find interests and activities that are absorbing
- talk to them about what helps them to concentrate
