Unfortunately, some of our lovely new Little Wandle Big Cat reading books are not being returned to school and this means we are short of books for the following week's Group Reading Sessions and do not have enough books to send home. Every child in the school reads a book three times a week and

We are a mobile phone-free zone

We believe in creating a welcoming attentive atmosphere during drop off and pick up times. Recently we have noticed an increasing number of parents using their mobile phones whilst dropping off and collecting their children, outside classrooms and elsewhere on the school site. A reminder that we are a mobile phone-free zone and we expect all adults to put their phones out of sight when they enter the school gates. Please greet your children with a smile, not while being distracted on your phone. Please continue to help us to create a focused and caring environment for our children.



Celebrating birthdays in school

Parents and carers often ask us if they can bring something for the class to celebrate their child's birthday. We kindly ask you not to provide any edible treats to give out as we have children in the school with various allergies. A lovely idea is to donate a book to your child's class for their teacher to read to the class on their special day. We are creating a book wish list and will share this with you. If you would like a book delivered straight to school, please leave a gift note saying who the donation is from and whether it is for a specific class. Thank you! Unused bike locks in the bike shed

There are a few bike locks in the bike shed which appear to no longer be used, these will be cut off and removed over half term. Please can you therefore remove from the bike shed any locks you wish to keep by Friday 25th October. Please could we remind you that bikes and scooters can be locked in the area by the Infant school entrance or in the bike sheds at the far end of the car park. They are left there at your own risk.

DBS check certificates

If you have had a DBS check through the school so that you can volunteer to help with trips, reading, cooking etc in school, and have received your certificate through the post, you must bring the certificate to the school office where the staff will take a copy - seeing your original certificate is part of our checking process. All parent helpers at our school **MUST** have a DBS check carried out by Coombe Hill Infants school *unless* you are already subscribed to the DBS update service for a similar role in another school. Please contact the school office with any questions about DBS checks.

Illness procedures

A reminder of the following important information regarding childhood illnesses.

Diarrhoea and vomiting in children



We ask you to strictly observe the 48 hour rule regarding vomiting and/or diarrhoea. It is so important that your child does not attend school for a clear 48 hours after a bout of either of these symptoms. This is in fairness to other children and to our staff as tummy bugs can spread extremely quickly among young children. Even if your child has a single bout of vomiting and/or diarrhoea/loose stools and then appears well they must remain at home for the full 48 hour period. We understand that this can be frustrating but we must ask for your co-operation. We are grateful to every parent who keeps their child at home for 48 hours and this is recorded as an authorised illness on your child's attendance record. Thank you.

Raised temperatures

If your child appears unwell in the morning please take their temperature and do not send them into school if their temperature is raised (the NHS define a high temperature as 38c). If your child has a high temperature do not give them paracetamol (ie Calpol) and then send them into school. They could have an infectious illness and will feel poorly at school later when the paracetamol wears off. Children should stay at home if they have a raised temperature in the morning and are unwell. They can come back to school when they no longer have a raised temperature and feel well in themselves.


Community Information


Congratulations to Sai!
