Dear Families,

We are delighted that so many of you attended the year group welcome meetings this week, we hope you found them useful. It is so rewarding for us to see such high levels of parental engagement, we know that this makes such a difference to your children.

Your children are very young and they are still learning how to make good behaviour choices, they do need help with this sometimes and it's important that we work alongside you. We have an agreed approach to behaviour and several parents have asked how they can find out more. We will hold a meeting to share this information. - For Forest school club please send your child into school with named wellington boots and weather appropriate clothing.
- If you have not paid for a club that your child has been allocated to they will not be on the club register and you should collect them at the usual time

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

#### Please label <u>ALL</u> clothing and water bottles clearly

We have already accumulated a large amount of unnamed jumpers, coats, water bottles and other items. With 270 children in the same uniform, it is not possible to return unnamed items, they will be put into our lost property box (next to Otter classroom) for you to check through. **Every item of PE kit, school uniform, coats, hats, scarves, lunch boxes, water bottles etc MUST be clearly named.** It can be upsetting for your child to lose their coat or jumper during the school day as they need these to go outside to play. If you are missing any named items please also check the lost property box. Please make sure that clothing is labelled very clearly with your child's full name.

#### **Punctuality**

Classroom doors open at **8.40am** for all year groups, when learning starts. We expect all children to be in their classrooms by 8.50am at the latest. If you arrive late you must take your child to the school office entrance and we will ask you to complete a late arrival slip. This is noted on your child's attendance record, with the reason for lateness and number of minutes late, we monitor this carefully. There is always very limited parking around the school site and the roads are always heavily congested with traffic (particularly on rainy days), this is not an accepted reason for lateness. Children who arrive late into their classroom can be confused as they will have missed the teacher's input. It also disrupts the teacher, teaching assistants and the other children in the classroom, please avoid this happening. Afternoon collection is at **3.05pm for Reception children** and **3.10pm for year 1 and year 2 children**. Please do not be late to collect your child, it can be unsettling for them when they can't see you when their classmates are dismissed and are taken to the school office. If children are collected late in the afternoon we also record this for monitoring.

#### **Attendance**

Our overall attendance target is 96%. Our overall attendance this week is **97.7**%. **Squirrel class** have achieved the highest attendance this week with **99.3**%, well done to Squirrel class!

#### Important message from our Governing Body

After half-term we will be holding a **parent governor** election and recruiting new **associate members.** School governors are volunteers who work as a team (governing body) to support the school at a strategic level. The role of a parent governor is no different to any other governor. Governing boards make strategic decisions and work together to:

- develop a vision and strategy for the school
- oversee financial performance and make sure money is well spent
- hold the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school
- engage with pupils, staff, parents and the wider school community to understand their views

Being a school governor is a commitment to attending governing body meetings which consider these issues. Parent governors offer their perspective on issues being discussed and they are not expected to represent the parent body or act as a spokesperson. Full training and support are also provided for the role.
