Health and Happiness week

All of the children in Years 1 and 2 had a Wellbeing Workshop with Shazia, our Educational Wellbeing Practitioner where they learned to recognise different emotions and explore ways of keeping calm.

Year 1 have been discussing what makes them feel happy. They drew pictures of things that bring them joy, from playing sports to painting and spending time with family. Year 1 also enjoyed their wellbeing workshop with Shazia! They reflected on their own happy places and how they make them feel calm and relaxed. They loved learning how to do a body scan which brought attention to how their bodies were feeling in the present moment.

Squirrel class enjoyed learning some relaxation techniques.



In Butterfly class - "As part of Heath and Happiness week we turned our classroom into a spa for the morning. The children all enjoyed a relaxing yoga session before they carefully chopped fruit which they juiced to create refreshing drinks and sliced cucumbers for their eye treatments. The children then took turns enjoying a relaxing foot bath with accompanying massages. As a healthy post spa snack we worked together to bake bread which we enjoyed at the end of the day"

£9: (NEW! NEW! NEW!) The Shape of Rainbows. My first mixed-themed poetry book since 2016 has something for everyone: *Peanut Butter Nutter, Police Car, Two Mums, Living Next Door to a Viking, Bad Smells* and *The Day I Ate My School* are just a few of the titles you'll find inside it.

£8: The Universal Zoo (The Conservation Place at the Far End of

Space). Fifty funny and a few sad poems – wonderfully and comically illustrated - about a menagerie of mysterious endangered alien creatures all cared for by the robotic Keeper in this special place, a long way from Earth.

£9: When the Bell Goes (A Rapping, Rhyming Trip through Childhood). Jam-crammed with fifty comical poems, plus jokes and silly facts, about Neal's (and your) journey through childhood, school days and growing up.
